Process to apply as an International Student for the Intensive Academic English Language Program

Required documents:

- 1. Completed Framingham State University Intensive Academic English Language Program Application.
- 2. Completed Certificate of Finances form (Click on the link to obtain this form).
- 3. Official bank letter (not bank statement) showing a minimum of \$24,000 U.S., available to support the applicant for the 12 months of study. The person who signs the Certificate of Finance form must be the named account holder on the bank letter.
- 4. Photocopy of the student's passport and any current visas.
- 5. E-mail these documents to Jane Decatur (jdecatur@framingham.edu) and mail the original bank letter to her office.

The I-20 is issued for 12 months of continuous language study.

When you receive the I-20, you will pay the required SEVIS fee of \$350 and obtain the necessary receipt. Then you will apply to your local U.S. Consulate for an F-1 student visa.

You may NOT begin your language study while you are in tourist status. If you are already here in the United States on a tourist visa, you will:

1) Apply for a change of status from tourist to student and wait up to 12 months for approval

OR

2) Depart the U.S. and apply for the F-1 visa in your home country and then come back into the U.S. with the F-1 visa.

You will be required to attend 18 hours of language instruction per week. The fall semester begins in early September and the spring semester begins in mid-January. Students who have not completed two consecutive semesters of study (fall and spring) are required to attend 12 weeks of summer session. Summer sessions are six weeks long (two sessions equal 12 weeks). You will find information about current tuition and fees at www.framingham.edu/esl, or you can request information by emailing at esl@framingham.edu.

You may apply for your F-1 student visa 90 days prior to the start date of the program, and enter the United State no more than 30 days prior to the start of the program.
