

Placement Information for Math, Writing, Reading and Foreign Language

Course progress forms have codes printed in the top right-hand corner. All **students are limited to one retake of the math test**. For those already matriculated, please emphasize the need for them to take a course or to study on their own for the retest (using CASA-supplied materials). Retests should be discouraged unless a student is within 10 points of the required cut score. **Beginning June 2007, all freshmen placing into General Math must register for the course in their first semester.**

Mathematics: Instrument --Accuplacer Elementary Algebra Test

T	Met testing requirement through course taken at another school--either a transferable course or an acceptable non-credit course.
