On February 3, 2012 at 2:30 pm, CELSS and the Office of Grants and Sponsored Programs will sponsor a workshop on grants for faculty and staff. The goal of the workshop is to provide an interactive discussion on private grants from foundations for faculty research and other purposes. In addition, the workshop will focus on researching and obtaining federal grants from agencies such as the National Science Foundation and the Department of Education.

The lead presenter will be Dr. Peter Ljutich, Director of Development at the American Academy of Arts and Sciences in Cambridge, MA. Dr. Ljutich is responsible for Corporate and Foundation Relations and Research. Prior to this, he served for 17 years at Brandeis University, rising from Development Writer to Assistant Vice President for Corporate and Foundation Relations. He has worked in all parts of the curriculum and has specialized in science grants, helping to secure funding from the W.M. Keck Foundation and David and Lucille Packard Foundation, among others. He received the B.A. degree from Rutgers University and the M.A. and Ph.D. degrees in European history from Harvard University.
