

FREQUENTLY ASKED TRANSFER QUESTIONS

How do I apply and what do I need to submit?

We recommend that you complete the on-line application; this will enable you to check the status of your application 24/7. An essay and letter of recommendation are required, the letter maybe from a teacher/professor, someone you work for or do volunteer work with. Unless you hold an associate degree at the time you apply, we will need your official high school transcript, SATs (are required unless you already have completed 30 semester hours of college-level course work when you apply), separate, original college/university transcripts, and official AP/CLEP score reports if you took either type of exam.

Are there application deadlines?

Yes, the priority filing deadline is December 1st for those looking to start in January and February 15th for those looking at September. Applications will still be considered beyond either date, but the availability of certain majors is not assured.

What courses will transfer?

Any college-level liberal arts or science courses completed at a regionally accredited college/university would be transferable with a minimum grade of a "C-".

Is an interview necessary?

Interviews are not part of the application process at Framingham State University. If you have questions, please feel free to call our office and either ask to speak with our transfer counselor or set up an appointment.

How many students transfer to Framingham State?

For fall 2010, approximately 395 transfer students entered Framingham State.

What is the student to faculty ratio?

17:1.

Are applications from veterans accepted?

Framingham State encourages applications from those who serve, or have served in the armed forces. If any courses were completed through a specific service branch or a college/university, official transcript(s) of that work is required when applying. We refer you to our Veteran and

Are internships available?

Yes! Internships may be combined with most majors.

Are there opportunities to study abroad?
