FSC Trip to Egypt

In May, Dr. Yaser Najjar of the Geography Department, an expert in the geography and culture of the Middle East, led a group of twenty-seven students, faculty and staff on a ten-day trip to Egypt. The group spent much of the time in Cairo and also took a four-day cruise down the Nile from Aswan to Luxor. They visited many of the historical and cultural sites of Egypt, including the Pyramids; the Egyptian Museum in Cairo with the treasures of Tutankhamen and many major archeological exhibits; the Valley of the Kings; a number of historical temples; the Aswan High Dam; a bazaar; and several old mosques.

Students went on the tour as part of a summer course with Dr. Najjar, Field Study of Egypt, focused on the geographical, historical, cultural and environmental characteristics of the country.
