



DOCUMENTATION GUIDELINES FOR LEARNING DISABILITIES

In order to receive academic accommodations due to a learning disability students must have proper and up-to-date documentation on file at the Registry for Students with Disabilities.

Proper documentation must include assessments from qualified evaluators (including educational psychologists) and scores from appropriate tests such as:

- **Wechsler Adult Intelligence Scale – III (WAIS-3)**
- **Wechsler Individual Achievement Test**
- **Woodcock Johnson Psycho-educational Battery**

An IEP or 504 plan is insufficient documentation of any disability.
