

## Tuition and Enrollment

Tuition for the Summer Program is \$150 per week or \$120 for weeks with a holiday (Week 2 and 7). A deposit of \$25 per week is required to register and reserve a space in each week your child will attend. The deposit will be subtracted from your child's total camp tuition. The balance of the tuition for each week is due by the Wednesday prior to the week enrolled.

### Tuition Discounts:

- One week free when you enroll your child in five weeks or more.
- 10% Discount for siblings and/or Framingham State University faculty, staff and students and enrolled in the summer program.

## Discover Books at Framingham State University

Our Summer Program runs for 10 weeks from May 23 through July 29, Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. You may choose which week or weeks to enroll your child. The program is open to all children between the ages of 2 years 9 months and 6 years old. Class size for each week is limited to 18 children.

Our child-centered program will provide opportunities for hands-on exploration, play and fun. The learning activities will focus on books written by the featured authors and integrate art, music, literacy, mathematics, and science as we learn about the author's words and stories.



The daily schedule will allow time for individual and group activities for in-depth study of selected books by the featured authors using materials in the classroom and resources around campus. The schedule will be flexible to respond to the children's interests, special activities, and weather.

## For Your Information

Children should bring their own nutritional lunch and beverage in a lunch bag or lunch box (labeled with name) from home each day. Each child also should bring a water bottle with his/her name on it. We will provide refrigeration for the lunches and water bottles. Children will be required to brush their teeth after lunch, so each child is asked to bring his/her own toothbrush and toothpaste.

Children should be dressed appropriately for the weather, as a good part of the day will be spent outside. Only sandals or shoes with a closed heel or with a strap at the heel, not flip flops, should be worn for the children's safety. We ask that each child bring a backpack each day, for a backpack makes it easier for your child to bring home art projects, notes, and summer collections.

We recommend that you apply sunscreen, especially on your child's arms, neck, face, and legs, at home before coming to the program each morning.
