So that we may process your application promptly, please have all of your supporting documents submitted as soon as possible. You may take up to two courses before being formally admitted into a graduate program. However, in order to be eligible for financial aid, you must be matriculated in a degree program and enrolled in at least two courses per semester.

Transcripts

Applicants must submit an official transcript from each college or university attended as an undergraduate or graduate student. To request a waiver for a program prerequisite or approval for transfer credit of an equivalent course, you must submit a course description and other appropriate documentation. Please note that a maximum of two (2) graduate courses may be accepted in transfer and applied toward the degree program. Foreign transcripts must be accompanied by certified English translations.

Letters of Recommendation

At least two letters of recommendation (three for MA Counseling Psychology) from professors, supervisors, and/or colleagues are required along with the completed Framingham State University [Letter of Recommendation form](#) that is included in the application packet. Recommendations must be sent directly to the University by the recommender.

Entrance Examinations

Applicants must submit an official test score report of the Graduate Record Examination (GRE), Miller Analogies Test (MAT), or the Graduate Management Admissions Test

(GMAT). Individual program test requirements are stated in the FSC Graduate Catalog. Most programs do not require the GRE or GMAT for students who have already received a master's degree; exceptions are the MA in Counseling Psychology, which requires the GRE or MAT and the MEd in English, which requires the GRE English Subject Test. Applicants with an undergraduate quality point average of 3.0 or above may waive the entrance examination to the MA programs in Health Care Administration, Human Resource Management and Public Administration; applicants should refer to the Graduate Catalog for more information.

Statement of Purpose

Applicants must submit a typed, 300-word statement (a 500-word statement is required for the MA in Counseling Psychology) discussing their motivation for seeking a master's degree in view of prior formal education, current job responsibilities (if applicable) and career plans. The applicants name should be indicated on each page.

Verification of Teacher Licensure

Applicants must submit a copy of any teaching license(s) required by the program to which they are applying.

Writing or Art Samples

A writing sample must be submitted for the MEd in Spanish and the MEd in English. Applicants should consult the Graduate Catalog for specific writing requirements. An art sample of ten (10) to fifteen (15) slides or digital images of the applicant's art work are required for the MEd in Art.

J. General Information

Academic Advising

Advisors are available day and evening to answer questions about the application process, provide details about programs, and assist with decisions regarding appropriate courses. Please call the Office of Graduate and Continuing Education at 508-626-4550, to schedule an appointment. Once you are admitted to a degree program, you will be assigned a faculty advisor from the department sponsoring your program.

Non-English Speaking Applicants

TOEFL scores are required of applicants seeking admission from non-English speaking countries. The TOEFL may be waived if the applicant has successfully completed at least two full academic years in a college/university in the United States of America, United Kingdom, Australia, New Zealand or Canada.

Financial Aid

In order to be eligible for financial aid, you must be matriculated in a degree program and enrolled in at least two

Tuition Management Systems (TMS)

The Monthly Payment Option offered through TMS enables students to budget all or part of their semester tuition costs - interest-free. The Monthly Payment Option may be used in conjunction with financial aid.

You may participate in this payment plan by budgeting your costs for fall or spring semester - intersession and summer session are not included. You must enroll with TMS **prior** to registering for classes and include your TMS account number on your registration form. Monthly payments must be made to TMS by the first of each month. This service is available for a small enrollment fee and includes personal account service and automated account information 24 hours a day. Application Deadlines

You are encouraged to submit completed applications before **July 1** for fall admission and **November 1** for spring admission. We cannot guarantee timely matriculation for students whose applications are received after these dates. Your application will not be reviewed until we receive all supporting documentation (see checklist). Students are admitted to graduate programs only for the fall and spring semesters, fall only for the MA in Counseling Psychology, but may take up to two graduate courses before matriculation. Applicants must matriculate before taking their third graduate course.

Applications to the **Food and Nutrition** programs who have undergraduate prerequisites to complete that are only offered during the day should apply by **February 1** for fall admission and **September 1** for spring admission. Students who apply late may still begin their studies if seats are available in the day courses.

Applications to the **Nursing: Education and Leadership** programs are accepted for the **fall semester of even years only**. Completed applications must be on file by **July 1** and will be reviewed after July 1, and you will receive a letter advising you of the University's admission decision by the end of July. Those received after July 1 cannot be guaranteed timely matriculation.
