Transcripts

Applicants must submit an official transcript from each college or university attended as an undergraduate or graduate student. To request a waiver for a program prerequisite or approval for transfer credit of an equivalent course, you must submit a course description and other appropriate documentation. Please note that a maximum of two (2) graduate courses may be accepted in transfer and applied toward the degree program. Foreign transcripts must be accompanied by certified English translations.

Letters of Recommendation

At least two letters of recommendation from professors, supervisors, and/or colleagues are required along with the

completed Framingham State University [Letter of Recommendation form](#) that is included in the application packet. Recommendations must be sent directly to the University by the recommender.

Entrance Examinations

Applicants must submit an official test score report of the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) when applying for the Med in Special Education.

Essay – Student’s Philosophy of Education

Applicants must submit a typed, 500-word explaining their philosophy of education. The applicants name should be indicated on each page.

Verification of Teacher Licensure

Applicants must submit a copy of any teaching license(s) required by the program to which they are applying.

Application Deadlines

Students are admitted to graduate programs only for the fall and spring semesters, but may take up to two graduate courses before matriculation. Applicants must matriculate before taking their third graduate course.
