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For the first program learning objective assessed what were the results/outcomes/findings/conclusion(s)?

Assessment data indicate a progression of skills in locating sources as students move from LIBS 250 to the capstone course, LIBS 450. For 2020-21, only 36% of students in LIBS 250 scored at the two highest levels on our rubric for Objective 3, whereas 75% of students in LIBS 450 scored at these two highest levels. We conclude that instruction in locating sources is appropriately scaffolded so that students are developing and strengthening their skills in this area as they progress toward completion of their degree.

We are still in the process of discussing potential changes or improvement based on this evidence. Overall, most students located appropriate secondary sources on their research topic. Locating primary sources is more difficult, and it was noted that many students in one section of LIBS 250 did not participate in the Ask The Librarian Discussion Board which was intended to help them search for primary sources.

Instructors of LIBS 250 and LIBS 450 met in Spring 2021 to discuss strategies for supporting students' skills in locating primary and secondary sources. The Liberal Studies advisory group met in Fall 2021 and again in the Spring 2022 semester to assess the evidence collected and recommend further changes and improvements.
