GPA Requirements: Students in early childhood and elementary education must maintain a minimum of **2.80 GPA** in all education courses (EDUC) and Psychology of Development (PSYC 200), and as a cumulative overall GPA in all courses taken at Framingham State University. Beginning 2015/2016 students must maintain a minimum of **3.0 GPA** in their UHIT concentration courses.
