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Examples of Full-time Students' Tuition*

15 hours = 2 morning courses	\$3,040
18 hours = 2 morning and 1 afternoon focus course	\$3,580
20 hours = 2 morning courses and Transitions course	\$3,710
21 hours = 2 morning courses and 2 afternoon focus courses	\$4,120
15 hours + Individualized Study Plan (14 hours)	\$4,020

* F-1 visa students must enroll for at least 18 hours of study per week.
 *Students with no prior English instruction should include an Individualized Study Plan with their other courses.
