## **The Age of Migration: *Interdisciplinary Perspectives***

An exploration of historical and current issues in domestic and global migration, ranging from the forces that impel people to



migrate to how migrants both integrate into receiving societies and maintain ties to their home countries. Students will put texts and scholarship from a range of disciplinary perspectives – literary, historical, sociological, geographical, and political – in conversation with each other to understand the lived experiences of immigrants and the social justice challenges they face across the globe.

Learn the fundamentals of GIS and how to integrate it into Massachusetts earth science and social studies curricula. Students are excited to embrace new technologies, especially those that allow them to explore real world problems and create compelling visualizations. GIS is a great tool for investigating topics with a geographic (place-based) component. We will explore a wide range of free apps and software useful in classroom environments. No prior experience with GIS is expected or required.
