

MINOR IN EDUCATION **(5 Courses)**

Notes:

- Courses in the minor may also be used to fulfill General Education (Gen. Ed.) requirements (see notation following course title). Depending on a student's major some Gen. Eds. may already be fulfilled.
- A minimum of three (3) course-credits (12 semester hours) in the minor must be completed at Framingham State University to meet the residency requirement.

The Minor in Education is designed for students who are exploring the discipline of education and related professions. Students can build skills and explore possible careers in teaching and learning, education policy and research, equity and social justice education, and related fields.

Only one (1) course may be taken within the student's major subject area.
